Children who are placed in foster care often show up on their foster care parent's doorstep with just the clothes on their backs and in a state of emotional turmoil. The 5<sup>th</sup> grade Student Ambassador program (patrols) would like to help to make this situation better for these children.

Foster children are often moved with little or no warning, so they typically move from place to place using only a plastic shopping or garbage bag to transport their belongings. The Student Ambassadors would like to help these children. We are asking for donations of new rolling suitcases, new backpacks, small new blankets. Please limit your donations to new items on this list. There are so many ways to help, but this currently an unmet need and we want to give just these items.

It seems like such a simple thing...a place for your belongings and a blanket to call your own, but to someone who has never had those things, it will mean the difference between being adrift and having an anchor.

She showed us some of the many resources available through the public library. Students learned how to search for books using the online library catalog and how to see if specific books are available as e-books (able to be read on mobile devices) and audio books (books that are read to you on your device). Download the Overdrive app and start reading without leaving the house! Two new resources are available through the free apps Hoopla and Zinio. Hoopla offers free movies, music and audio books that can be streamed on your device and Zinio offers many popular magazines that can be read for free on your device.
