Due to state and district demands related to school accountability, class size amendment and teacher evaluation based on student academic growth, it is imperative we create balanced classrooms that also consider individual student needs.

For administration, one of the most important jobs we have is determining the most appropriate class for each child. In doing so, we first consider individual student needs based on the student's academic and behavioral history. Student's current teachers are in the process of completing a data sheet for each student in their class. This data sheet includes information such as academic data, information about classroom habits, children that should not be placed in the same classroom and other special needs and considerations. We try to match each student with the teacher whose strengths we feel will best complement his/her needs. We then carefully balance each class in order to insure a diverse and equitable group of students for each teacher.

We value and appreciate your input. Please feel free to fill out the Parent Input form on our website and submit it before June 1st. I appreciate your understanding and trust that we will make every student placement with a great deal of care, thought and purpose.

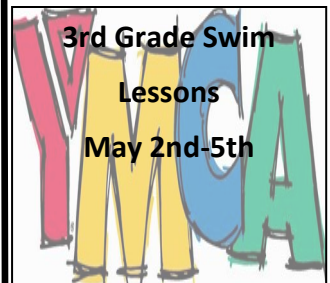
