




The front office will no longer call into the classrooms concerning lunch

- Immunization record on Florida HRS form 680 (Must have two varicella shots - chicken pox)
- Physical examination (within 12 months)
- Two proofs of residency in the R. B. Hunt School Zone, i.e.
   FPL (electric) or other utility bill, mortgage statement or lease.
