

The American Academy for Pediatrics, AAP, published a paper this month offering tips on picking the best togs related to play, media, school readiness, literacy promotion, injury prevention, toxicology and poverty. The best togs are those that support warm, verbally rich interactions and quality time between child and caregiver. Good choices are puppets and blocks for encouraging a spark of imagination and problem solving. Children's books can be used with togs to promote pretending games. The local library is an awesome resource. The AAP reinforces the importance of limiting screen time with media being one hour or less per day and content being quality programming. Steer clear of electronic and digitally enhanced togs. There is no evidence that interactive media promotes better learning. Keep your choices focused on togs that promote active, creative, hands-on and pretend play.


