Parent Tips...What can you do?

Talk to your kids about the dangers. Ask them what they know about any dangerous links, apps or games. Discuss a plan that includes what they can do if they receive a message that encourages them to behave in inappropriate ways. In addition, there are adults within their schools that can address this topic with your children.

Check your child's internet device regularly. The recent challenge is not the first one to encourage kids to participate in dangerous activities, and it will not be the last.

Take social media seriously. Educating our kids will empower them to stay away from challenges such as this, and even encourage them to help their friends. If you only know a person on the internet, you do not really know that person!

Keep your relationship with your kids strong and solid. Keep the flow of communication open and consistent, focused on love and trust to keep them safe. Silence is not prevention.

Kindergarten and Online Registration

The St. Johns County School District (SJCSD) will begin early registration for the 2019-2020 school year March 1. This registration is only for children new to the school district, including those entering kindergarten.

Early registration can be completed online at or by visiting the student's assigned school website. To find the assigned school, enter your street address on the Attendance Zone Locator. To be eligible for public kindergarten in the SJCSD, children must be 5 years old on or before September 1 and must reside in St. Johns County.

Other requirements for registration:

- Birth certificate/Guardianship Documents
 - Documentation of a health examination performed within one year of enrollment
 - Proof of completed required immunizations on Form DH680
 - Proof of residence per the Residency and Guardianship Policy.
