I am extremely concerned about several things that have happened this year with the use of student cell phones. Our school was put on lock down last week and the Sherriff's Department, City Police, Park Rangers as well as a helicopter and two police boats were looking for an "alleged kidnapper" due to prank calls made on the way to school by students on their cell phones. I also received another report of students looking at inappropriate pictures on the bus on student cell phones. We cannot regulate the use and misuse of cell phones on the bus. Our drivers simply cannot monitor student cell phone use while they are driving and maintaining overall control on the bus.

Here is the St. Johns County School District cell phone policy:

Students may possess cellular telephones and other wireless communication devises at school, on buses and at school functions. However, they must be turned off, stored in student's backpack, purse, locker, or vehicle. The device shall not be used during the school day without administrative approval or on school buses to and from school. Failure to comply may result in the device being confiscated. Repeated failure to comply will be considered defiance of school rules.

It is a parental choice to give students these devices. I know that many of you have good reasons for doing so, but we will be enforcing the policy listed above. Having a smart phone is like walking around with a computer with access to many things that are not appropriate for our students. It takes great maturity to handle this responsibility and not to follow pressure from peers to use phones inappropriately.
