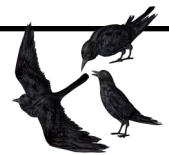

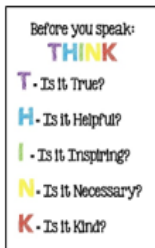

November 2021 Counseling Corner

October Character Counts = RESPONSIBILITY

- In support of our district's Character Counts program, in October we focused on RESPONSIBILITY – how to be responsible with our words and actions. Students in grades K-1 learned the difference between big and small problems and conflict resolution strategies. Our second graders identified effective strategies for dealing with teasing. In grades 3 and 4, students focused on the hurtful effects of rumors and gossip and learned to THINK before they speak. Fifth graders identified the differences between rude, mean, and bullying behaviors and discussed ways in which they could be Upstanders and help.
- October was also a busy month for social-emotional learning as it hosts Red Ribbon Week and Unity Day. During Red Ribbon Week, we focused on making healthy choices for our minds and bodies and with our words and actions. On Unity Day, our students joined other students across the country in pledging to stomp out bullying. We all wore orange in support of this national movement and signed a school pledge: *We promise to stand against bullying by speaking with KINDNESS, reaching out with ACCEPTANCE, and being a friend through INCLUSION.*



November Character Counts = CITIZENSHIP

- In November, our focus is on CITIZENSHIP. Students are learning what it means to be a good citizen in their classrooms and with their friends and ways in which they can show their citizenship on our school campus. Grades K-3 are identifying kind ways in which they can be good citizens to their friends. Our 4th and 5th graders will focus on ways in which they can contribute to creating a more inclusive and caring school campus.
