The School Advisory Council (SAC) is a partnership between parents, school staff, community members, and school leadership. By working together, SAC helps support student achievement, improve school programs, and ensure that decisions are made with input from the people who know our students best. Parent and community voices are an important part of helping our school grow and succeed.

What is SAC?

The School Advisory Council is a group established through Florida law to help schools improve student achievement and maintain a safe, positive learning environment. SAC serves in an advisory role by reviewing school goals, monitoring progress, and providing input on important school decisions.

What Does SAC Do?

- Monitor the School Improvement Plan (SIP)
- Review school strengths, needs, and priorities
- Provide feedback and recommendations to support student success
- Help determine how SAC funds are used to support school improvement goals
- Gather parent, staff, and community input through surveys and discussions
- Promote collaboration between families, school staff, and the community

Important Voting Information

To conduct official SAC business, a physical quorum must be present. More than 50% of official SAC members must be physically present before a vote can occur. Only official SAC members who are physically present may vote.

Attendance Expectations: Because votes cannot occur without a quorum, it is especially important for SAC members to attend meetings where voting is scheduled. There is flexibility if a member must miss an informational or discussion meeting; however, attendance at voting meetings is essential so the council can continue supporting our students and school.
